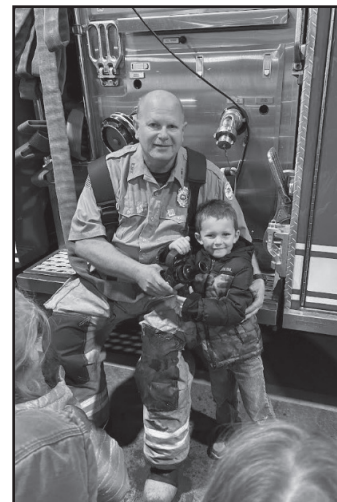
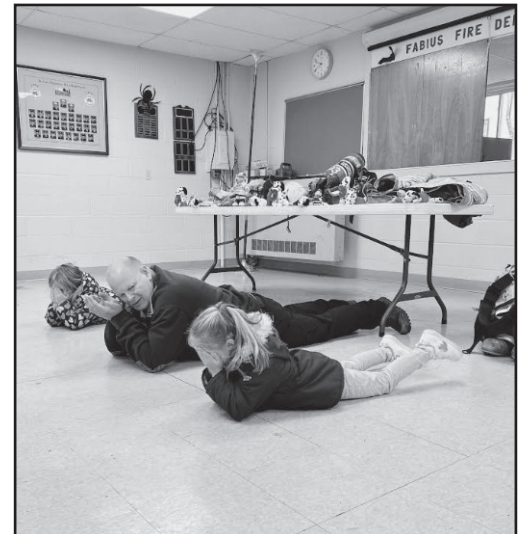

## FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Recently, principals Sasha Rasmussen and Jason Martin presented the Board of Education an analysis of student performance spanning from 2019 to 2024. In looking at both New York State assessment and Aimsweb benchmarking, this analysis covered grades K-8, with an emphasis on performance trends in English Language Arts (ELA) and math, as well as science at grades 5 and 8.

In our elementary level assessment data, recent NYS testing showed varied proficiency rates across grades 3-5 in ELA for 2024. Our math performance data reveals stronger results, particularly in grade 4, where 77% of students demonstrated proficiency considerably above the state average. Our grades 3 and 5 continue to show a positive, upward trend as well. We know that NYS testing is only one data point and continual benchmarking through Aimsweb allows us to further refine and identify student needs. Looking at that data in our current kindergarten cohort, which includes students from last year's universal pre-kindergarten (UPK) program, it shows promising early literacy and math skills. Our entering kindergarteners are stronger than years prior, which continues to reinforce the positive effects of our UPK program. This data has helped guide the implementation of our expanded curriculum initiatives, including Eureka<sup>2</sup> for math (UPK-grade 5) and Wit & Wisdom for ELA (grades 3-5).

At the middle school level, the assessment data from 2019-2024 shows both our ELA and math proficiency rates continuing to improve. Our grade 8 science assessments indicated an increase in performance over the four-year period, with 2024 data showing 83% of students achieving above-average proficiency at the highest levels, levels 3 and 4. The Aimsweb benchmarking data aligns with these results, showing the majority of middle school students performing within expected grade-level ranges, though with some variations across subject areas that have informed our intervention strategies.

To support academic growth, the district has implemented several targeted initiatives and support systems. At the elementary level, first-year implementation of Eureka<sup>2</sup> math curriculum and Wit & Wisdom ELA program is progressing well, with teachers receiving ongoing professional development and collaboration time. Middle school support includes ELA and math AIS intervention periods, W.I.N. (What I Need) time, and ongoing data team meetings to monitor progress. Additional student support includes peer tutoring, Regents bootcamps, and a conditional eligibility program to ensure comprehensive academic assistance across all grade levels.

The analysis of this student data highlights both our achievements and opportunities for growth across grade levels. In a comparative analysis, Fabius-Pompey's overall test scores are above the average of all other NYS schools. For those interested, the presentation and detailed data are located in the agenda of the November 5 Board meeting item 6.B. within the BoardDocs portal.

The implementation of new curricula and targeted support programs positions us well to address identified needs, particularly in early literacy and math foundations. Moving forward, the District remains focused on maximizing the impact of our UPK program, strengthening K-8 math and ELA performance through new curriculum initiatives, and maintaining our academic support systems. Through these coordinated efforts, we continue our commitment to support students' academic success.

## HEALTH OFFICE NEWS

### *You can help stop the spread of germs!*

Illnesses, like the flu and colds, are caused by viruses that infect our nose, throat and lungs. These illnesses usually spread to others, when an infected person sneezes and/or coughs.

- Always cover your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze.
- Cough or sneeze into a tissue and then WASH your hands.
- Wash your hands frequently!
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth!

When available, wash your hands with soap and warm water -- rubbing vigorously and scrubbing all surfaces of your hands. Wash for a full 20 seconds! The friction from scrubbing helps to remove the germs.

When soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizers and rub the gel into your hands until they are dry. The alcohol in the gel kills the germs.

Germs are often spread when you touch something contaminated with germs and then touch your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs can live for a long time on surfaces like doorknobs, desks and tables. When you are sick, have flu symptoms, and/or a fever over 100 degrees, please stay home to get plenty of rest and consult with your health care provider.

### *IS IT A COLD OR THE FLU?*

**Common flu symptoms:** fever (usually over 102 degrees and can go up to 104 degrees lasting up to 3-4 days), cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches, fatigue (tiredness), some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults, per the CDC.

**Common cold symptoms:** low-grade fever, runny nose, cough, sore throat.

The common cold has no cure and should improve with time.

### *Remember, the key is to stay healthy!*

Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of liquids and eat nutritious foods. Practice healthy habits all year long!!

Parents, be sure to email the health office when your child is absent or will be tardy.

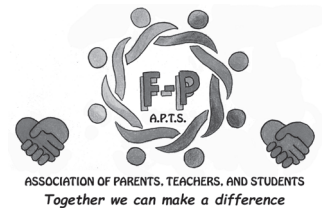
