FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

As we are now well into the 2024-2025 academic year, the Board of Education (BOE) is excited to share our key focus areas. Our priorities are designed to support enhanced student outcomes, improved operational efficiency, and stronger connections with our community. Here's a glimpse into what we're working on to make this year a success.

To maximize our productivity and ensure focused discussions, the BOE is taking several steps to streamline meeting procedures and committee operations. We are implementing a more efficient agenda structure, reorganizing our public comment sessions, and striving to keep meetings to two hours. This will help keep conversations concise, allowing us to address key issues more effectively. Additionally, we have developed a pre-set presentation list for meetings so information provided to board members and the public is more evenly distributed across sessions. Monthly newsletter columns will continue to keep the community informed and up to date on important matters and initiatives. We are also considering other ways to foster open dialogue with the community.

To ensure our students receive a high-quality, well-rounded education, the BOE is developing a dashboard of key indicators. This tool will provide a consolidated snapshot of data on several benchmarks, allowing for continuous assessment of how well our programs are meeting student needs. Some of the metrics we are considering include test scores, mental health service utilization, and attendance. Monitoring test scores will allow the identification of areas where students are excelling and those that need improvements. Tracking the use of mental health services will help us determine the number of students being served through programming and individual consultations, as well as those needing continuous support. This will ensure that our mental health resources are accessible and effective. Attendance is a sign of student engagement and will allow us to identify trends that may indicate underlying challenges. Following key metrics will facilitate improvements in our curriculum and programs to foster student success at every level.

To ensure student voices are present in decision-making, we will start work on developing guidelines for student representation on the BOE. This will give students a direct platform to communicate with the board about issues that impact them, providing a valuable perspective for our ongoing efforts. Understanding what drives success beyond high school is also a focus this year. We aim to identify aspects of the Fabius-Pompey educational experience that contribute most to our graduates' post-graduation achievements. Still in its infancy, this project will involve gathering feedback directly from former students. By learning from our graduates, we can adjust our curriculum and programming to better prepare current students for the future.

The BOE is committed to creating a supportive, forward-thinking environment that prepares our students for both immediate and long-term success. We are grateful for the support of our families and community and thank you for being a part of this journey with us.

HEALTH OFFICE NEWS

A SIMPLE WAY TO STAY HEALTHY

Hand washing doesn't take much time or effort, but it offers great rewards in terms of preventing illness. Adopting this simple habit can play a major role in protecting your health!

WHEN TO WASH YOUR HANDS

As you touch people, surfaces and objects throughout the day, you accumulate germs on your hands. In turn, you can infect yourself with these germs by touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Although it's impossible to keep your hands germ-free, washing your hands frequently can help limit the transfer of bacteria, viruses and other microbes.

EXAMPLES OF WHEN TO WASH YOUR HANDS

- Before preparing or eating food
- Before inserting or removing contact lenses
- After using the bathroom or changing a diaper
- After blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing
- After playing with or touching a pet
- After handling garbage
- After touching public surfaces such as door knobs or shopping carts, etc.
- After playing outside
- Anytime they feel dirty

HOW TO WASH YOUR HANDS

Wet both of your hands with warm water, apply soap, and then rub and scrub vigorously for at least 20 seconds. Remember to scrub all surfaces, including the backs of your hands, wrists, between your fingers and under your fingernails. Rinse well and dry with a clean or disposable towel or air dryer. If possible, use your towel to turn off the faucet.

ALCOHOL-BASED HAND SANITIZER

Alcohol-based hand sanitizers are an excellent alternative when soap and water are not available. If your hands are visibly dirty, however, you should always wash with soap and water.

DRESS FOR THE WEATHER

As the weather changes it is important to dress in clothes that match the temperature and conditions outside. Dressing appropriately positively impacts our health and comfort.

ON COLD or SNOWY DAYS

When temperatures drop, it's crucial to layer clothing to trap body heat. Coats, gloves, scarves, and hats help protect your body and help prevent frostbite, hypothermia, and cold-induced illnesses.



DOODLE


